Useful Class Information

Classes

- Each class is 3 ½ hours in length and costs \$20.00.
- There are no special classes offered this year, however there are 4 full day classes.
- There are 18 different projects offered at all levels by 10 instructors.

Skill levels

Each class is listed as an **Open, Beginner, Intermediate, or Advanced**. These levels are listed with each project’s description page in the registration packet.

- **Open** means that it is suitable for all skill levels and could have a general pre-requisite.
- **Beginner** indicates that the participant need not have prior experience with wheat weaving, and there are no pre-requisites for the class.
- **Intermediate** means that the participant has a moderate amount of prior experience working with straw, and there could be some pre-requisites for the class.
- **Advanced** means that the participant has had extensive prior experience with straw art, there are more specific skills needed in order to succeed in the class, and there will be pre-requisites.

Pre-requisites

- Before signing up for a class, it is necessary to carefully check the pre-requisites for that class.
- These are skills in straw work that the instructor is requesting that the participants already have, as they are necessary for the project but will not be taught in class.
- The purpose of pre-requisites is to give each participant the opportunity for success and to facilitate a smooth flow of the class such that the project is more likely to be completed in the allotted time.
- Adherence to the pre-requisites is important.

Work prior to class

- Some classes may have required work the instructor has requested be done before coming to class.
- It is important that these requests are honored and the work completed as directed.
- In some cases, the NAWW Plait Directory is referred to with the appropriate page number.
- If you do not understand pre-requisites you can contact the instructor.

Supplies for class

All convention participants must bring the following general wheat weaving supplies:

- Their own wheat (cleaned, sorted, and soaked before class, as indicated in instructions), soaking tray (provided on request by convention), towel, weaving thread, pointed scissors, ruler, pin board and pins. Specific supplies for each class are listed by the instructor and must be brought to class by each participant.
- Reminder, if you are traveling by air, be sure to put glue guns and all sharp objects, no matter how small, in your checked luggage as these items may be confiscated. If you are not checking luggage you may ship items to the hotel.

Material kits

- Some instructors are offering kits of supplies for their classes.
- It is required that class participants must purchase all kits offered.
- Instructors will be notified by the registration chair as to how many participants have signed up so they know how many kits to prepare.
- If you wish to have more than one kit, you must contact the instructor to see if he/she is able to supply extras.
- The teacher will hand out the kits at the beginning of class. Please try to have the exact amount of money ready.

Wheat straw and supplies from vendors

You may contact your vendor ahead of the convention if you would like to pre-order wheat and supplies for your classes. Make arrangements with them to pick it up if needed before the Straw Expo opens on Friday at 12:30 pm.

Wednesday, April 18, 2018

Tour Option #1: Old Idaho Penitentiary, Idaho Botanical Garden, lunch, Idaho State Capitol

We will leave in cars from the hotel at 8:30 for a 9:00 guided tour of the **Old Idaho Penitentiary**. *"It was built in 1870 and is one of only four territorial prisons in the nation open to the public. During its 101 years of operation the "Old Pen" was home to some of the most desperate criminals in the West."* The tour lasts about 1 ½ hours, with a video at the end. Cost: \$6.00 adults, \$4.00 seniors (60 and older). (The Old Pen ranks #3 on Boise's top 138 things to do.)

Idaho Botanical Gardens: *"The Idaho Botanical Garden is a lush 15-acre tapestry of dappled shade and vibrant splashes of color. A peaceful haven nestled in the Boise Foothills, located in the heart of Old Penitentiary Historic District. The Garden promotes gardening in the Treasure Valley using native and domestic plants that are adapted to the intermountain region."* Cost: \$7.00 adults, \$5.00 seniors. We will learn how the Garden's history is linked to the early years of the "Old Pen" during an hour guided tour. (The Gardens, which rank #6 of 138 Things to do in Boise, are adjacent to the Old Idaho Penitentiary.) Upon conclusion of the tour, we will have lunch, then head for the State Capitol.

The **Idaho State Capitol** tour is free and begins at 1:00pm. The capitol is the state's most treasured building, and ranks #4 of 138 things to do in Boise on Trip Advisor. A docent will describe the history and unique characteristics of the building. The tour will conclude around 2:30, and we will head back to the hotel at that time.

Tour Option #2: World Center for Birds of Prey, Basque lunch at the Marketplace, Basque Museum

World Center for Birds of Prey: Leave the hotel at 9:30 for a 1 ½ hour tour, then 30 minutes for individual roaming. *"Experience birds of prey eye-to-eye and explore the mysteries of their flight, survival, and relationship with humans. Live bird demonstrations and falconry heritage tours complement hands-on exhibits for all ages."* (Ranks #2 of 138 things to do in Boise, Idaho). Cost: \$10 adult, \$8.00 seniors (62 and older).

The Basque Museum: After visiting the Birds of Prey, we will head to downtown Boise for an authentic Basque lunch. The afternoon tour begins at 1:30. *"See the latest in Basque artifacts representing thousands of years of rich history and culture. The Basque Museum brings to life the triumphs and struggle of the Basque people with many stories from the U.S. as well as their homeland."* In addition to learning about the culture, our tour guide will make sure we see their Jai alai Court. This sport involves the use of a woven basket known as a Cesta. The museum director is working to gather several of these handmade baskets which should be enjoyable to wheat weavers. We will return to the hotel by 4:15pm. (The Basque Museum ranks #11 of 138 Things to do in Boise.) Price: adults \$5.00, seniors \$4.00 (65 and older).
