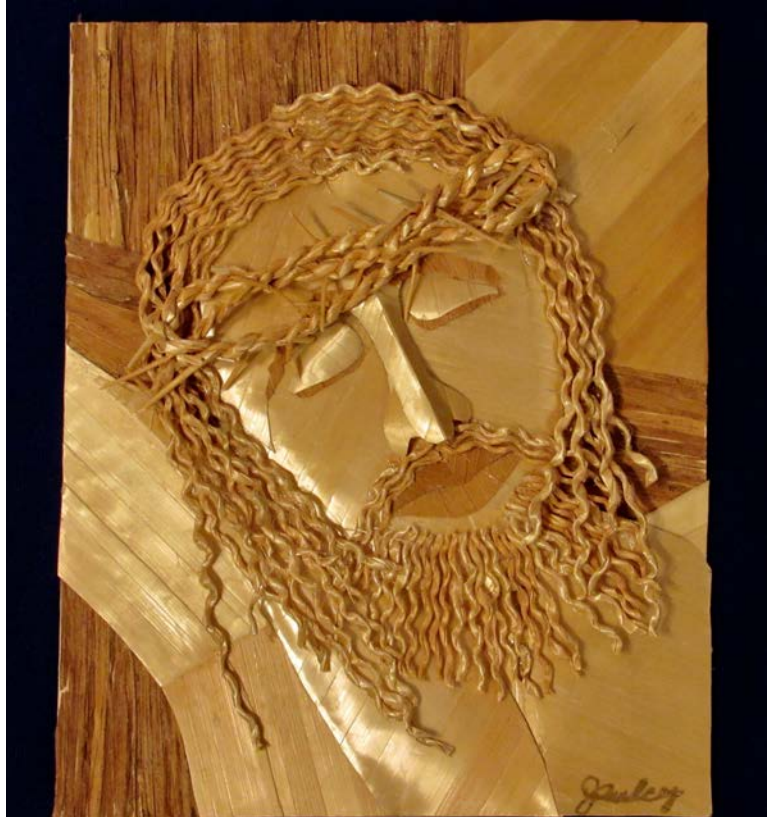

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**Instructor's Comments:**

This picture is best framed, but no framing will be done in class. In order for this piece to be finished or near finished, it is important to have all plaits for hair premade before class and straw opened and flattened but NOT GLUED for marquetry. The wider the straw the better for marquetry – flattening iron good for flattening straw.



**Pre-requisites:** how to prepare straws for marquetry, twisted rope plait

**Skill Level:** Intermediate

**Size of Project:** 10" x 8"

**What needs to be done before class:** Prepare straw for marquetry (DO NOT GLUE ANYTHING). Make 15-20 4-straw rope twists

**Techniques:** Twisted rope add-ins, paper sculpture for marquetry

**Suggested Wheat:**

Soft straw – barley is very good, but other soft wheat is also acceptable

**Straws Needed:**

60-70 fine to medium straws 12"-14" long

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30 second joint straws for marquetry  
scraps of leaves for cross, eyebrows, eye lashes and mouth  
30 medium straws 8"-12" long

**Other Supplies:** 8"x10" mat board, 2 pieces of cardstock, glue, spreader, tacky glue, hot glue and gun, small clothes pins, pencil, 6" ruler, x-acto knife, small piece of FINE sand paper

**Materials Kit:    Cost:** \$5

**Kits are required if offered. Kit includes:** 8"x10" mat board, cardstock (with pattern already printed) sandpaper, leaves, for woodbark
