When I hear the word "Kansas," I'm put in mind of horses and cowboys galloping wildly on the flat open prairies of the Midwest.

Skill Level: Intermediate, but anyone is welcome.

Size of Project: 6" x 9" x 1"



Prerequisites: Ability to scissor straws through a plait; Braid.

Prework: None

Techniques Taught in Class:

Hair braid and back braiding on itself; Scissoring technique; Inserting straws into flat weave; Reinforcing single extending straws; Bending straws to achieve motion.

Straws Needed:

- *20 straws 18" long without heads
- *45 small thin straws without heads
- *3 or 4 long straws if framing

Supplies Needed:

General wheat weaving supplies; Glue; Hindenburg or another tool to flatten straws.
Optional: Picture frame and background material or paper.
