When I was teaching art for the lower and middle grades, one of my favorite mediums was tooled foil. Fourth graders would make tooled crosses and sixth grade made Christmas ornaments. Martha Varoz Ewing also inspired me with her use of straw work with tooled tin. I have used gold colored metal, but you can use aluminum or copper colored metal as well.

 14 Medium thickness straws at least 18" long Black bearded wheat is okay

- One 5" square of soft metal for tooling*
- Black acrylic paint

- Paper towel
- Pin board and pins
- ♦ 5" square of mat board*

- Masking tape
- Small popsicle stick
