## **Other Supplies Needed**

- Quick grab tacky glue
- ◆ E-6000 glue
- Ruler
- Tweezers
- Pinning board and pins
- Small, narrow paintbrush for brushing glue on

the back sides of the egg outline

- ♦ 3 needle tool, needles spaced <sup>1</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" apart
- Dog tooth comb
- Small needle, eye large enough for threading the straw split at the end of covering the wooden discs

### Class Kit:

\$16.00 includes the following:

- 15 Swiss threads;
- 2 8mm wooden disc beads; 1-10mm wooden disc bead
- 5 long straw splits for spreuers, 3 straw splits to cover wooden discs
- 1 long needle and cork
- ½" circle of straw paper
- 5" x 7" mat board
- 24 antique sequins
- All templates needed for project

### What will be taught in class: NAWW Plait Directory - First Addition

- Wantele; 3 needle rose; basic spreuer
- looped needle rose (half hitch with loops)
- covering 8mm & 10mm wooden beads
- gluing antique sequins together

### Students should know:

- How to tie a Swiss Lace weaver's knot.
- Must have some experience in making Swiss Lace, **NOT** a beginner's class.
